Recently, information has come to my attention from the National personnel, the NMRA has an estimated 55,000 to 65,000 individuals participating in NMRA activities in one form or another. All those Subscribers, Associates and/or Friends, who are receiving information and/or attending events as guests of our regular members. Susquehanna Division 11 is guilty of promoting this trend as approximately 46% of our current mailing of the Susquehanna Sidetracks is to Subscribers. These individuals are benefiting and feeding on the information and/or programs of our division, the MER, and the NMRA without paying their own way.

I, as your Superintendent, am proposing an additional change to our By-Laws. This change is to the status of "Subscribers" who choose not to belong to the MER and the NMRA. The Susquehanna Division 11 will require Subscribers to be sponsored by a Regular Member and become Regular Members within 1 year of their Subscriber status. This status will be offered once per individual addressee and/or organization. Those Subscribers who after 9 months to 1 year, who do not choose to become Regular Members, will be dropped from the division mailing list and will loose their ability to attend division events.

My personal feelings as a member of the NMRA and MER since 1964 are: "...Since the Susquehanna Division 11, MER, NMRA is offering monthly divisional educational model railroad events, the Subscriber has been provided ample opportunities to decide if they want to support the Susquehanna Division 11, MER, and the NMRA in their pursuit of the various aspects in the Hobby of Model Railroading..."

NMRA Achievement Program

The NMRA has made a significant change in the Judges Score Sheet, effective March 1, 1997. The point structure has been change to reflect the improvements in the manufactured material available to the hobbyist and the wealth of prototype technical research materials now available, compared to that of the mid 1960's when the A.P. was first started. The chart below shows those changes.

The emphasis has shifted from scratch building to prototype conformity. So, when you have those contest entries, be sure to have your photos, drawings, and plans available for the judges to review along with your models.

January 27, 1997, was the 25th anniversary of the merger of the Norfolk & Western and the Southern railroads to become the Norfolk Southern Railroad.

The Union Pacific Railroad has expanded and improved its "Aztec Eagle" intermodal service to several former Southern Pacific cities, from Mexico to Laredo, Tx.

Conrail and Guiford Rail Systems (CSX), has launched "Down East Express", a direct intermodal rail service linking Waterville, Me to major U.S. markets in Chicago, Kansas City, St. Louis and Atlanta.

The Kansas City Southern Railway Company and GATX, have formed a new joint venture which specializes in railroad rolling stock leases. Initially they will carry 2800 freight cars and 280 locomotives under Southern Capital Corporation LLC.

Chilled-Out Cargo. West Coast catalog aficionados are in a state of despair this month (January) following derailment of a freight train carrying bulk mail near Seattle, recently. No one was injured as five freight cars toppled into Puget Sound. Model in a Minute

You have all those beautiful trucks sitting around and no place to show them. Lets get them out on the highway and show them off.

First find a place where they can best be seen. Get out your digging tools and set up some barricades, cones jersey walls, etc.

Bring out your backhoe and front end loader (I use a dremel tool) and dig up a place in the road.

Now you can have lots of activity: men working or watching, machinery working, trucks hauling dirt and rocks and best of all your best big rigs stuck in traffic on the highway where everyone can see them.

If you want to spend some more time on this, you can detail the construction site itself: put in curbs, manholes, etc.



The Lower Anthracite Model Railroad Club is the largest model railroad club in Pennsylvania, covering 3475 square feet of space. This HO scale model railroad is 100% scenicked, has a combination of CTC and DCC controls, has an elevated control booth and Closed Circuit TV cameras to keep the trains in sight for operational purposes. The layout models the former Reading railroad, which served the local area. Many local landmarks and historic buildings are modeled and represented at various areas on the layout. This club also has a small N scale layout, a HO modular layout, railroad artifacts, a small kitchen, and meeting room areas.


This layout will be featured in a future issue of Model Railroader, as they were interviewed and photographed in the Fall of 1996.

The club is marked with a "C" and an arrow on the map. They are across the street from the US Post Office. Route 61 is recommended if traveling from the East. 1-81, Minersville exit, RT 901 to RT 61 is strongly recommended if traveling in from the South or West. RT 125 is not recommended, as it twists and winds around too many blind corners and you must share the road with large coal hauling trucks.



Wm. Nesbit's HO/HOn3, Fall River Logging and Mining Company, 230 plus square foot multi-level layout is under construction, with 98% of the track roadbed completed. The layout is designed to capture the look and feel of a Mountain railroad. Designed to have both switching and operational aspects by more than one person. The layout is in a room containing many railroad artifacts and Maintenance of Way equipment from both standard and narrow gauge railroads. Outside are an EBT RR mud flat, and two Fairmont Track Speeders, an M-19 (purchased in 1964) former-MA & PA and S-2E former-C & O.



From William Fraley's home:

Go West on RT. 322, after you pass the traffic light for Wal-Mart/Sam's Club, look for and follow signs to I-83 North, once on I-83 North, stay in far right lane, get off at Exit 29 Union Deposit Road (William Nesbit's home is about 2.5 miles East). At top of exit ramp, turn right, you are now on Union Deposit Road, move to the center or left lane, go past the Point Mall, go straight at traffic light (Sunoco Station on right), go straight at next traffic light (past Turkey Hill mini-mart), 5760 is about 0.9 miles after the traffic light and is on your left at the large evergreen trees, the house sits back about 150 feet from Union Deposit Road and has parking for about 6 to 8 vehicles, home is across from Jehovah's Witnesses Church (permission has been granted to use their parking lot), if you drive past the VFW, then you have just passed 5760. Turn around at Fairmont Drive (first street on left) about 0.2 miles. I do not recommend using the first street on the right as it is difficult to see on coming traffic in order to make the left hand turn, back to 5760.



Jack's Mt. Holly and Mechanicsburg Railroad is a freelanced bridge line in Cumberland County, PA. Both steam and diesel, leased from the PRR, move the tonnage across the line. Scenery is 90% complete on this 24° by 24° HO scale layout Ali motive power on this railroad is controlled by Zero 1 command control. The Zero 1 is a carrier control system which permits locomotives to run independently of each other without the need of separate electrical blocks. Jack has modeled a full block of structures that recreates a section of Mechanicsburg.

Jack is the holder of NMRA Achievement Program certificates in Golden Spike: Volunteer; and Scenory




Nittany Valley Model Railroad Club 100 North Allegheny Street below Confer's Jewelers Bellefonte, PA 16823

The Nittany Valley Model Railroad Club is a fully scenicked HO scale layout, below Confer's Jewelers across from the Court House in Bellefonte. This layout is designed to be operated in the entire space available. There is not much meeting space and it is not handicapped equipped.

The Susquehanna Division #11, will hold its meeting and clinics at the Clinton Central Railroad, outside of Lockhaven, in Castanea.

Directions: From the South take RT 150, to the intersection with RT 144 (Allegheny Street). This is the center of Bellefonte, Confer's Jewelers is next to the Court House. [Note: The gold colored parking meters are for a maximum of 15 minutes, <u>do not</u> use them, also, <u>do not</u> use the parking lot on top of the hill, it is for the prison only.] From the North, I-80 exit #23, at Milesburg, RT 220 South to RT 144 South to Bellefonte. RT 144 is N. Allegheny Street, Confer's Jeweler's is #100.

Bellefonte is also home to the Bald Eagle and Northern Railroad, who operates out of a former PRR station 3 blocks South of the Nittany Valley Model Railroad Club. The Bald Eagle and Northern has an N scale layout in the station. They also have excursions powered by some of the last remaining RDC cars.
