In a ceremony at Orbinsonia, Huntingdon County, on May 19th, Lt. Governor Mark Schweiker officially marked the extension of the boundaries of Allegheny Ridge State Heritage Park to incorporate a corridor within the county that includes the East Broad Top Railroad.

Allegheny Ridge State Heritage Park, designated in 1992, celebrates the iron, steel, coal, railroad and canal heritage of the Allegheny Ridge through the conservation and promotion of cultural, historic, educational and scenic resources. This heritage area covers the Huntingdon, Blair, Cambria, and the Windber area of Somerset Counties. Included in this region is the Horseshoc Curve, Altoona Railroaders Memorial Museum, Allegheny Portage Railroad, Hollidaysburg's Canal Basin Park, Windber Coal Heritage Center, Johnstown Flood Museum and now the East Broad Top Railroad.

This is great news for eastern narrow gauge fans as the East Broad Top Railroad is now eligible for regional public-private funding to conserve and enhance its operation.
