November Layout Tour

The Division 11 November event will be a tour of three home layouts on November 7th. The first will start at the home of John Kennedy in Mechanicsburg at 9:30 AM to 11:00 AM and then continue on to the layouts of Jim Clay at 11:00 AM to 12:30 PM and Bob Charles at 12:30 PM to 2:30 PM, if Bob is available. If Bob can not open up then Jim Clay will be at 12 noon to 2:30 PM.

Here is a brief synopsis of each layout. A map is included to the first layout. Maps will be available at this layout for the other two.

John "Jack" Kennedy: Jack's Mt. Holly and Mechanicsburg Railroad is a freelanced bridge line in Cumberland County, PA. Both steam and diesel, leased from the PRR, move the tonnage across the line. Scenery is 90% complete on this 24' by 24' HO scale layout. All motive power on this railroad is controlled by Zero 1 command control. The Zero 1 is a carrier control system which permits locomotives to run independently of each other without the need of separate electrical blocks. Jack has modeled a full block of structures that recreates a section of Mechanicsburg. Jack is the holder of NMRA Achievement Program certificates in Golden Spike, Volunteer and Scenery.

Jim Clay: Jim's layout is an around the wall 8' by 14' by 16' HO scale PRR railroad, a double track design, with a Digitrax (DCC) system. This layout is patterned after the article in *Model Railroader*, "Building the PRR". This will be your last time to see this layout, as Jim is moving and the layout will not be in his new home. For those of us who are looking into DCC, you need to come and ask questions. No, Jim is not moving out of the Harrisburg area, just into a larger home nearby. Jim tells me that if any one is interested in getting this layout, you need to contact him soon.

Bob Charles: Bob's 30' by 30' HO scale PRR railroad is a double track point-to-point design with continuous running built into the track plan. The layout contains major staging yards at each end of the mainline and a large double ended yard modeled in the middle. It also includes a single track Pennsy style branchline and an HOn3 logging branch. All track and turnouts are scratch built. Bob has incorporated some innovative ideas into his benchwork and uses laminated lattice roadbed throughout his layout. Scenery is started.






