# Museum To Offer Virtual Locomotive Triving Experience

LANCASTER, Pa. -- Starting Saturday, visitors to the Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania can climb inside a 140-ton locomotive and drive the train down the tracks from Lancaster to Harrisburg -- at least virtually.

The cab of an electric locomotive built in 1969 by General Motors for Conrail has been equipped with a new flatscreen monitor and computer hardware designed to simulate the experience, complete with signals, grade crossings and radio transmissions.

"It's as close as most of us will ever come to actually being a railroad engineer," David Dunn, railroad museum Director, said.

The museum used a \$36,000 grant from the North American Railway Foundation to install the simulator. Norfolk Southern donated the cab.

The simulator will be dedicated at a ceremony in Strasburg.

The "Cornwall Railroad" depicts iron ore operations in central Pennsylvania and includes a portion of the PRR's Lebanon Branch as well as some Reading right-of-way. For operations, Dave Husman's MS Access car-card program is used and a computerized CTC system written in JMRI is utilized. The location is not handicap accessible, and bathroom facilities are not available.
